# Key Terms

- Medicaid is health insurance for low- and no-income people. There is no monthly premium and low or no out-of-pocket costs.
- Medicaid is called *Medical Assistance (MA)* in Minnesota.
- Medicaid is NOT the same thing as Medicare, MinnesotaCare, or MNsure.
- A *Navigator* is someone certified to provide free enrollment help with MA and other programs.

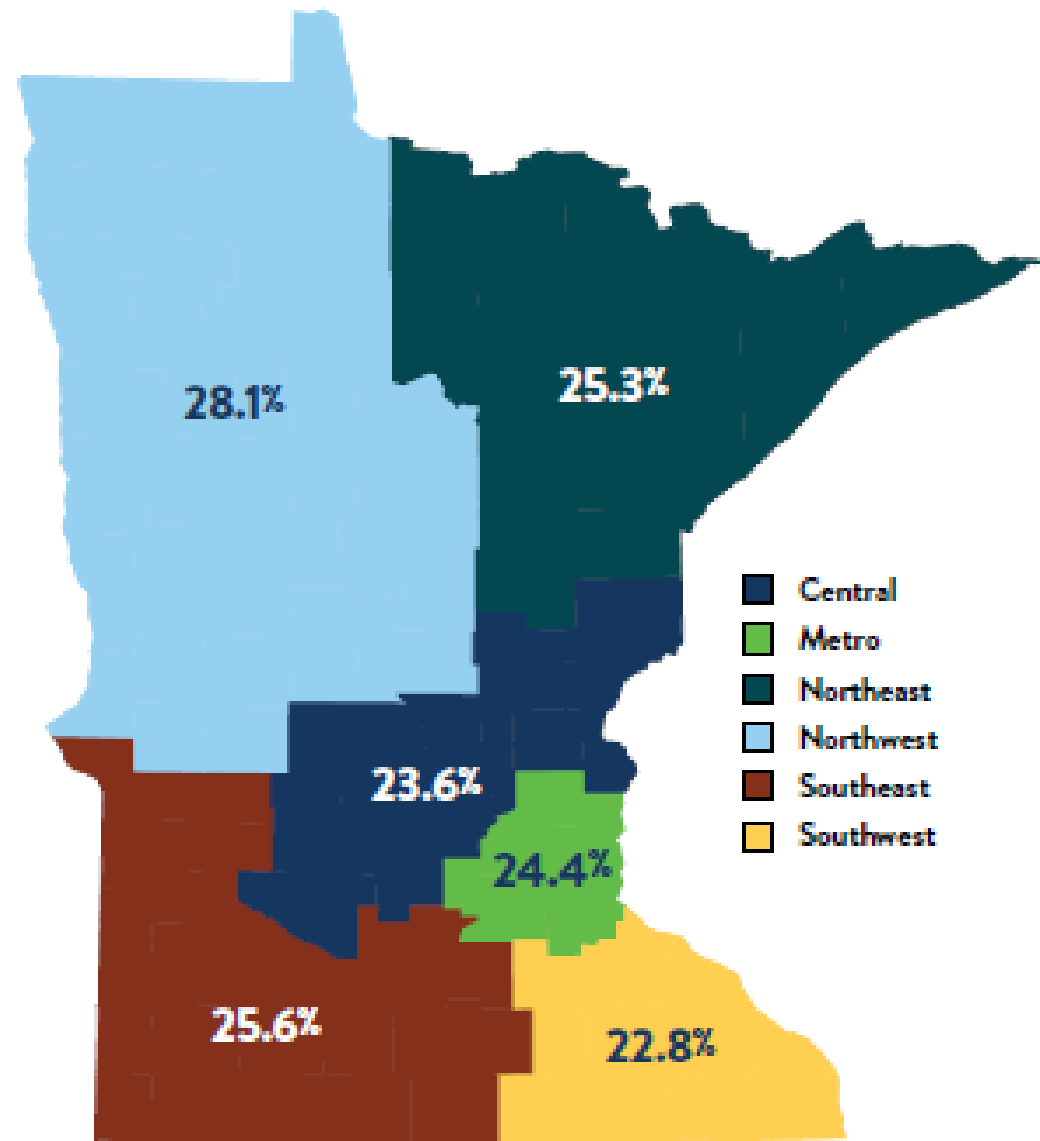

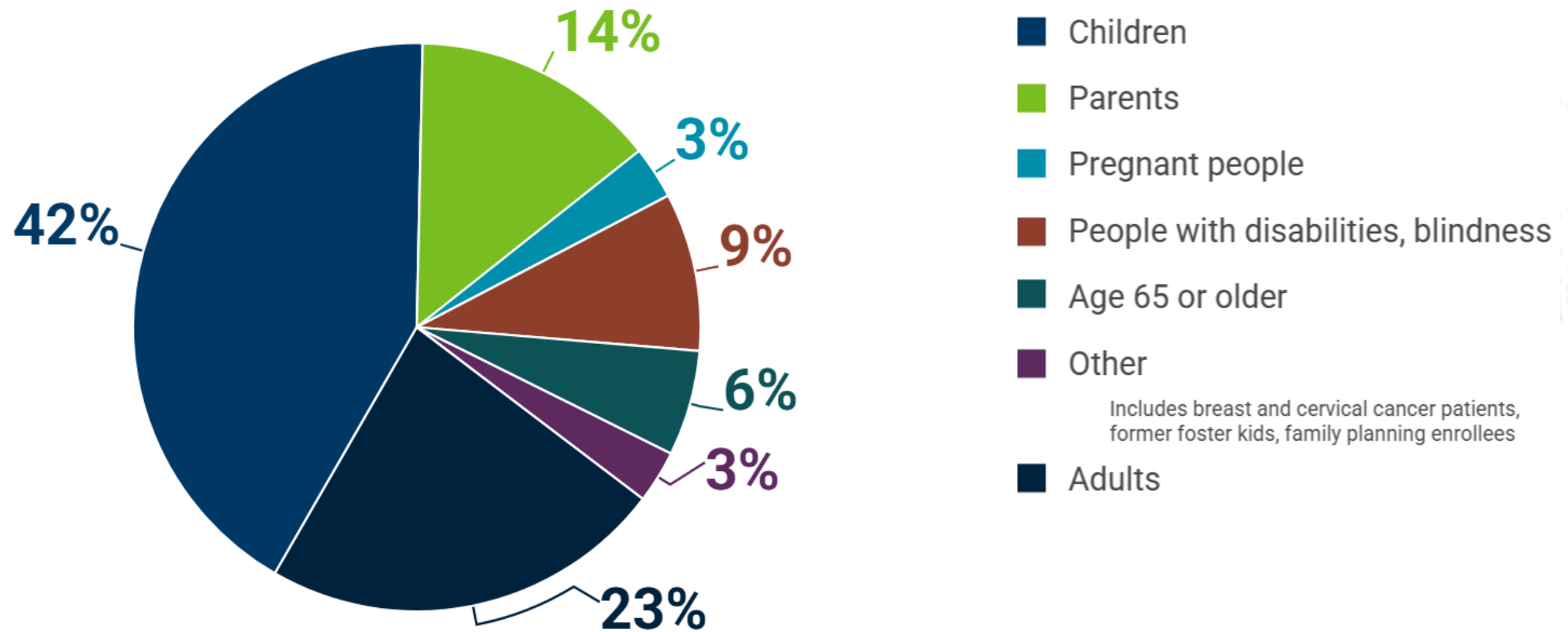
- Preventive and primary care

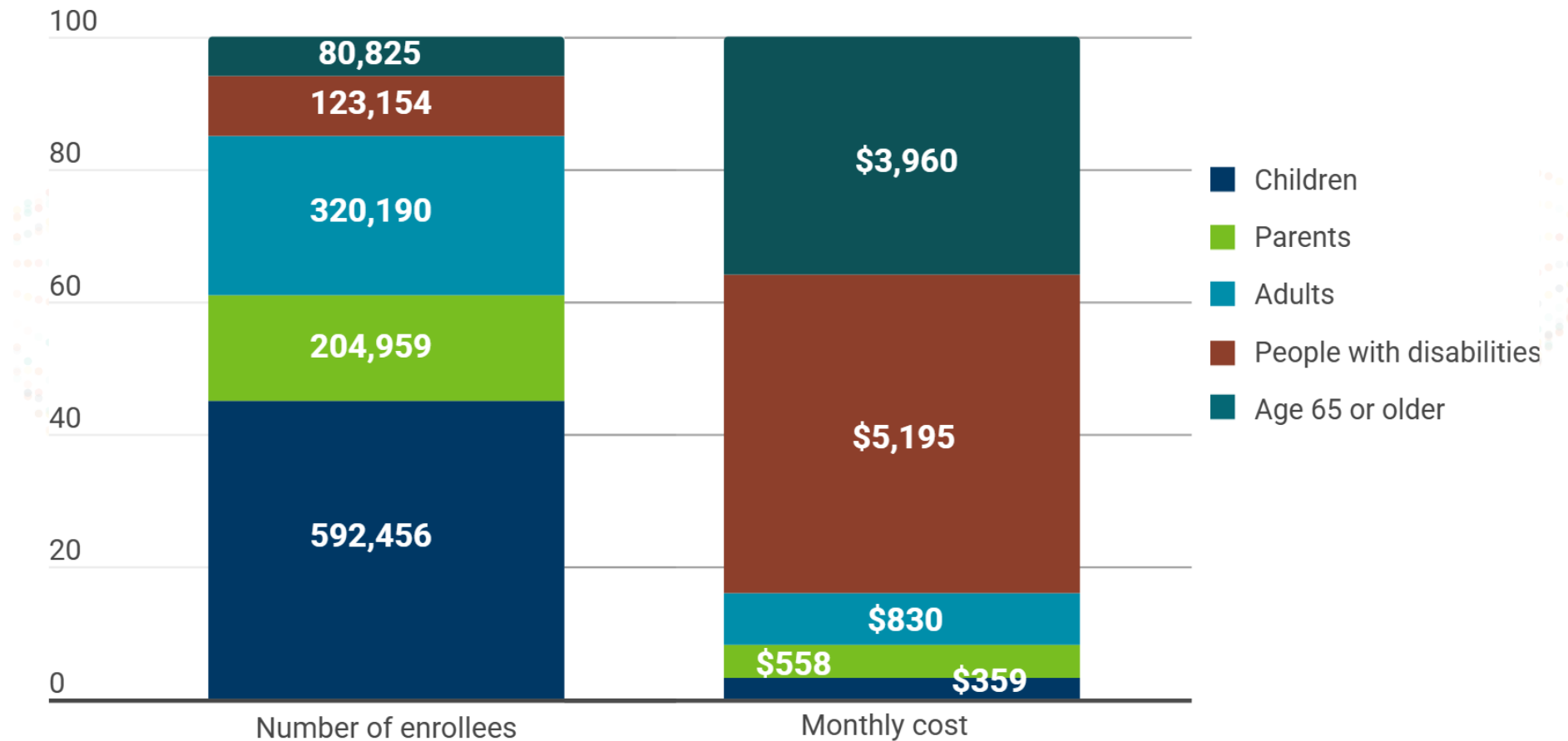

# Medical Assistance enrollees by eligibility category

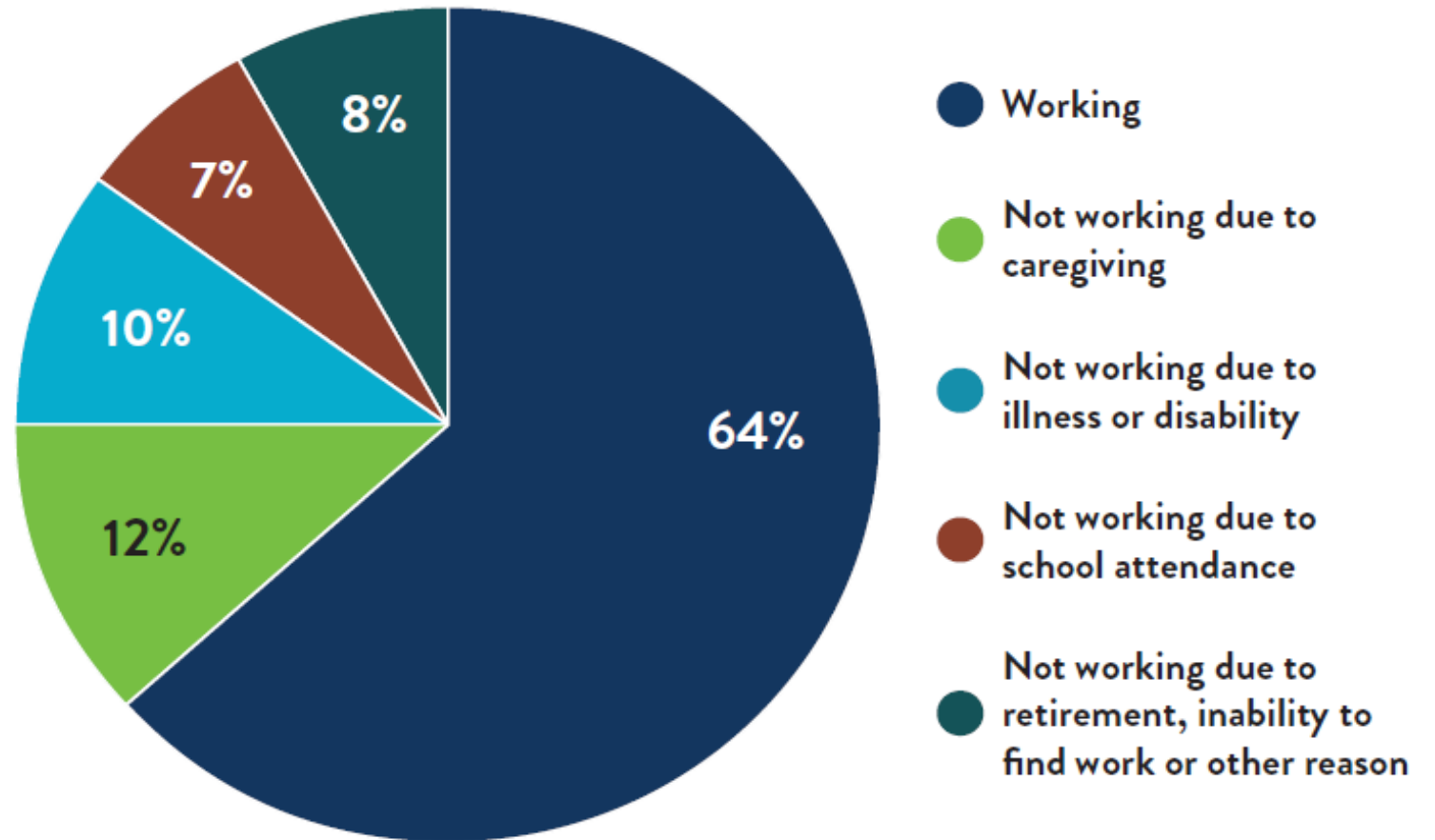


# Enrollment and cost by eligibility group

Medicaid enrollees work status nationally



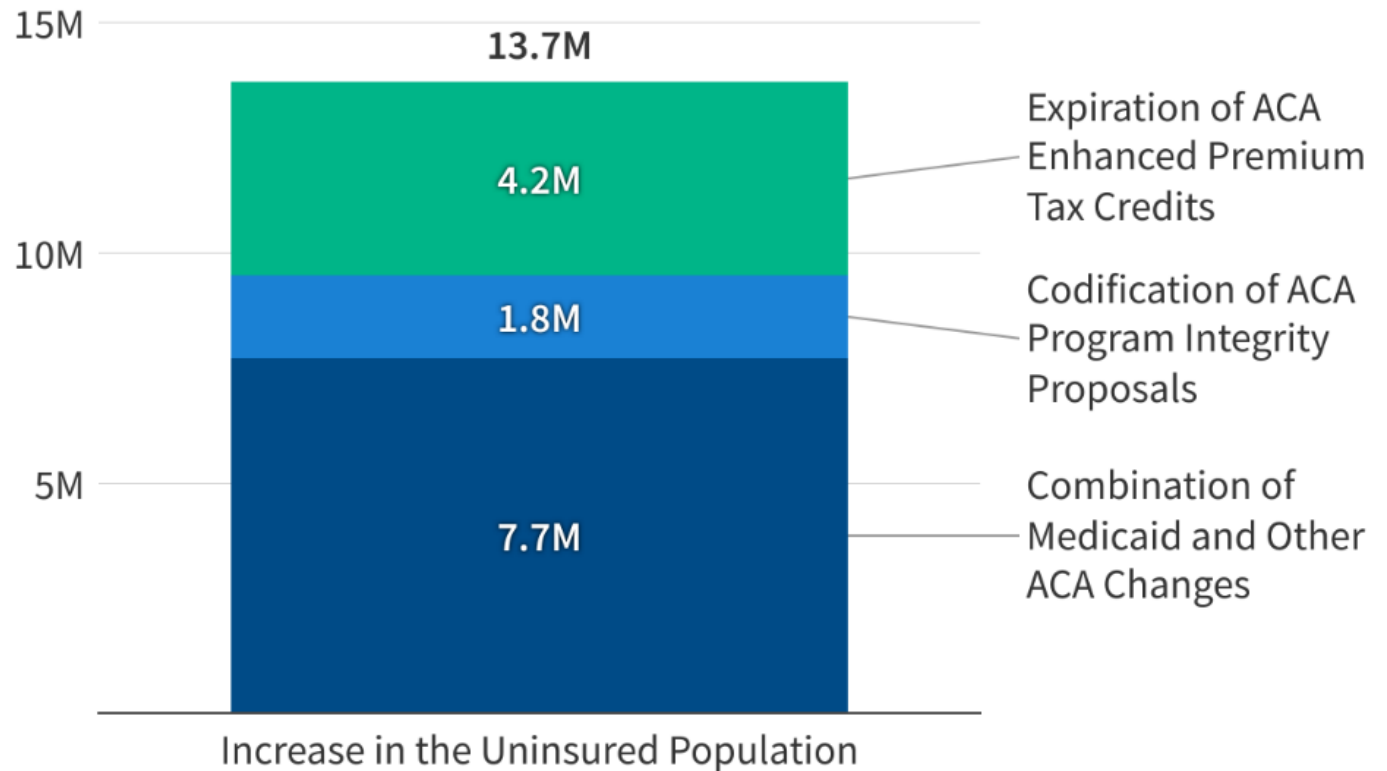
